The Remembrance Parade will be held on **Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> November**. We operate a rolling road closure from the Broadwalk (outside the chip shop) down the A6, turning down Station Road and into the Park. The road closure runs from 14.40 – 15.00 precisely (people start meeting up at the Broadwalk from 14.15) the service will be held at the war memorial in the park.

## So, what is REMEMBRANCE DAY...

We take part in Remembrance Day to honour those who serve to defend our democratic freedoms and way of life.

People unite across faiths, cultures, and backgrounds to remember the service and sacrifice of the Armed Forces community from United Kingdom and the Commonwealth.
