During the month of April there have been recent shed burglaries being reported where gardening equipment, bicycles and power tools etc have been stolen.

With this in mind, we would like to remind you about your security, please be vigilant and report suspicious activity to the police.

Derbyshire Capture

Derbyshire Capture allows you to securely upload dash cam footage or digital footage of road traffic incidents directly to us.

Upon submission of your footage, you will receive an email outlining the possible outcomes of your submission. A Roads Policing officer will then review your footage and contact you if any criminal proceedings are to be undertaken on the back of your submission or if any further information is required from you to ensure that a thorough investigation, if necessary.

Parking Issues

How to Report Parking Issues:

- **On-Street Illegal Parking (Yellow lines, Permits, Bus Stops):** Report to Derbyshire County Council via their [online form](#) or call 01629 533190.
- **Obstruction/Dangerous Parking:** Contact [Derbyshire Constabulary](#) via 101, Live Chat, or their online reporting tool.
- **Disabled Bay Misuse:** Report to Derbyshire County Council.
- **Unauthorised Encampments (Car Parks):** Report to [Derbyshire Dales District Council](#) on 01629 761212.
- **Abandoned Vehicles:** Report to [Derbyshire Dales District Council](#).

For vehicles blocking driveways, contact the local council for potential assistance. For urgent safety risks, dial 999.

Community Speed Watch

Community Speed Watch is a national initiative in communities where speeding and road safety is of a concern. The aim is to monitor and record the speed and registration of speeding vehicles through communities in an attempt to improve driver behaviour. By encouraging drivers to slow down and thereby preventing collision. The activity allows the police to send letter of advice to the registered keeper of the vehicle warning them of the driver's behaviour and dissatisfaction of the community through which the vehicle travelled.

If you have a concern regarding your community and would like to set up a scheme in your area or join a current scheme, then get in touch with the team to discuss.
